Notice Inviting Tender

The High Commission of India invites sealed tenders from experienced companies for cleaning and removal of overgrowth and trash on vacant plot measuring 11700 sq.m. located at 65C, Ebene Cybercity. The details of work are: i. a) Cutting of long grass, weeds and bushes, etc., b) Cleaning of trash, c) Carting of weeds and trash, d) Application of herbicides. Full payment shall be released upon completion of work only. The terms and conditions are mentioned in Annexure.

The tender should be submitted in two separate sealed envelopes. The first envelope should contain the details of qualification, past experience of the company and name of satisfied clients. Conditions of Tender for Clearing of Vacant plot at 65C Ebene

The payments would be paid in one lump-sum amount after certified completion of work as per payment plan (negotiated and agreed by High Commission of India and Contractor).

Once the time period for completion of work has been negotiated, the work will have to be completed within the agreed time-frame.

The Contractor would ensure that workers start the work at the site as soon as possible but not later than one week after the award of work as per time schedule prepared by Contractor and approved by High Commission of India.

Liquidated damages would be levied at the rate of 2% of approved tendered cost on Contractor for each day of delay unless the High Commission of India is convinced that there were compelling reasons beyond the Contractor's control for the delay.
